WARNINGS

Failure to follow these instructions may result in electric shock, fire, or burns, which can lead to property damage, bodily injury, or death. When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should always be followed, including the following:

1. Unplug the ice maker from the power source before cleaning, repairing, or servicing.
2. Exercise caution and provide proper supervision when using the appliance near children.
3. Do not use this or any other appliance with a damaged cord. If the power cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, service agent, or a similarly qualified person to avoid hazards. The ice maker must be positioned so that the plug is easily accessible.
4. For optimal performance and safety, place the ice maker in a location where the plug is easily accessible. Plug it into a polarized, dedicated outlet, avoiding circuit overload by sharing it with other appliances. To ensure a safe connection, fully insert the plug into the outlet.
5. Do not place the power cord on carpets or other heat-insulating surfaces. Do not cover the cord. Keep the cord away from high-traffic areas. Do not immerse the cord in water.
6. We do not recommend using an extension cord that may overheat and pose a fire hazard. If an extension cord is necessary, use a cord with a minimum gauge of 14 AWG and a rating of at least 1875 W.
7. Do not use the ice maker outdoors. The appliance is intended for indoor use only.
8. The ice-making device should be placed in an area not exposed to direct sunlight.
9. Maintain at least 15 cm (6 inches) of clearance between the back of the ice-making device and the wall.
10. Maintain at least 15 cm (6 inches) of clearance around the appliance.

11. Do not use liquids other than drinking water to make ice cubes.
 12. Do not clean the ice maker with flammable liquids. Vapors may create a fire or explosion hazard.
 13. Do not tilt the appliance.
 14. If the ice maker has been in a cold environment, wait a few hours before plugging it in to allow it to reach room temperature.
 15. The appliance must be grounded.
 16. To prevent hazards due to instability, the appliance must be placed on a flat and even surface.
- Before installing or servicing this product, read the repair manual/user manual. Follow all safety precautions.
- The appliance must be disposed of in accordance with federal or local regulations. Follow all instructions for handling the appliance to ensure safe disposal.
- DO NOT** use mechanical devices to defrost the ice maker.

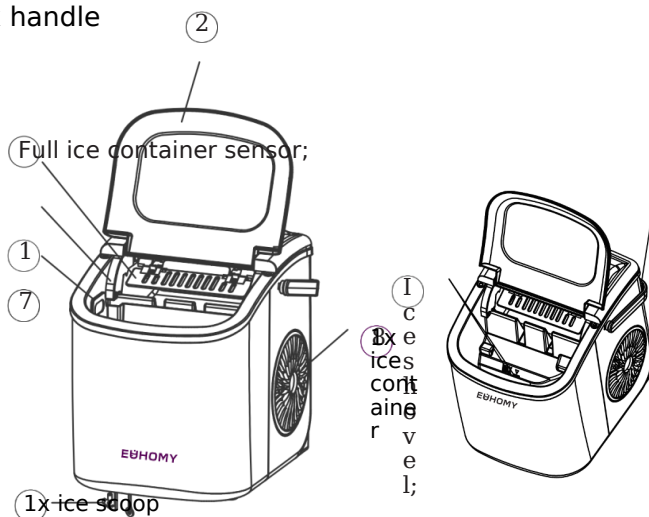

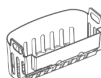

b. In standby mode, press and hold this button for 5 seconds to activate the self-cleaning function. The ADD WATER and ICE FULL indicators will flash. Press again to start the cleaning function.

B. POWER Indicator: In standby and ice-making mode, the POWER indicator remains green.

C. ICE FULL Indicator: This light turns on, signaling that the ice container is full. When this light is on, the appliance stops making ice.

D. ADD WATER Indicator: This light turns on, signaling that there is no water in the reservoir.

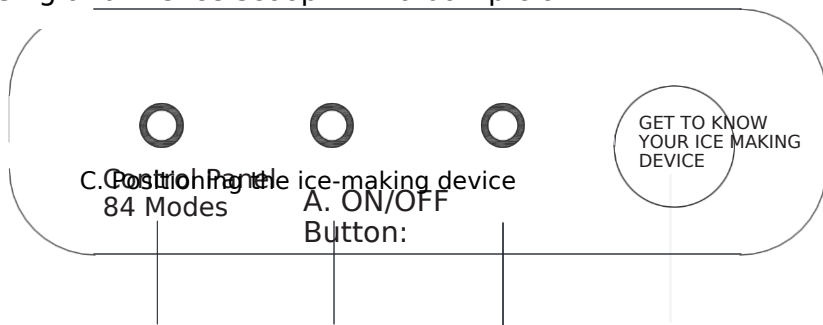
1. Setting up the ice maker

A. Unpacking and Inspection

Remove all external and internal packaging. Check that all accessories are included in the set. If anything is missing, contact our customer service department.

B. Preparing the ice maker

Remove all tapes and straps from the appliance; take out the accessories located inside the ice maker. Clean the interior of the housing and the ice scoop with a damp cloth.



D. Allow the refrigerant to stabilize

E. Accessibility of the plug

Position the appliance so that the plug is easily and directly accessible.

Important Safety Warnings

Caution: The appliance must be grounded

- Plug the appliance into a grounded outlet; never remove the grounding pin.

DO NOT use an adapter or extension cord. Failure to follow these instructions may result in fire, electric shock, or death.

Electrical Connection

- Provide a dedicated outlet for the ice maker.
- Use outlets not controlled by a switch.
- For replacement of the power cord or plug, contact a qualified technician.

Requires a grounded outlet of 110-120 V, 60 Hz.

Grounding Method

For safety reasons, the appliance must be grounded. Use the provided grounding plug and connect it to an appropriate grounded outlet. If such an outlet is not available, contact a qualified electrician to have one installed.

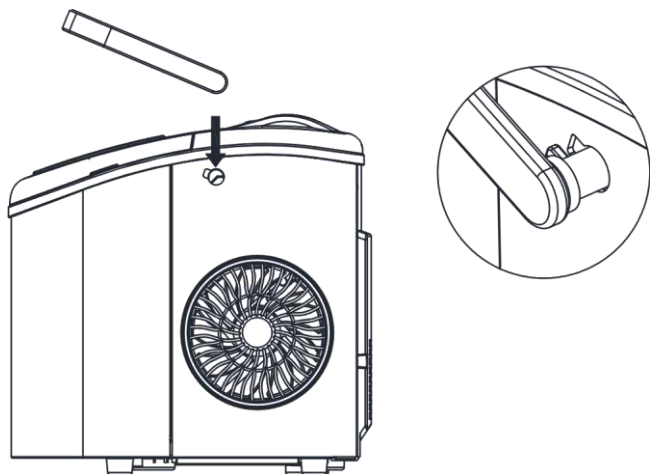

CLEANING THE ICE MAKER BEFORE FIRST USE

* We recommend using our cleaning agent for product maintenance.

1. Remove the ice container.
2. Clean the interior with warm soapy water and a soft cloth. We recommend using our cleaning agent.
3. Rinse the interior and internal parts with clean water. Drain the water by removing the drain plug located at the front bottom. Insert the ice basket and connect the power.
4. Press the ON/OFF button and hold it for 5 seconds. The device will start a 30-minute self-cleaning program, and the ICE FULL and ADD WATER indicators will blink simultaneously.
5. After the self-cleaning process is complete, disconnect the device from the power supply and drain the water. Don't forget to reinsert the drain plug.
6. Clean the exterior of the ice maker with a mild detergent and warm water.
7. Your ice maker is ready for use!

HOW TO OPERATE THE ICE MAKER

WARNINGS

- * Before first use or after a long break in using the ice maker, it is recommended to clean it beforehand.
- * Before starting ice production, ensure that the water drain plug is inserted into the device; otherwise, the ice-making function will not operate correctly.
- * Fill the device only with drinking water. Use only drinking or distilled water.

1. Starting the device

Step 1: Remove the ice container and fill the tank with drinking water.

Step 2: Place the ice container back in its position.

Step 3: Connect the device to the power supply, and the ice maker will enter standby mode, with the POWER light turning red.

2. Ice production process

-

Press the ON/OFF button to start the device. The device will begin making ice when the POWER indicator lights up green.

-

Press the ON/OFF button again to stop ice production.

3. Water addition indicator

-

If the ADD WATER indicator lights up and the device stops working, add water to the tank, and the device will automatically restart.

4. Ice full indicator

-

When the ICE FULL indicator lights up, the device will stop working. To resume operation, the ice must be removed.

-

When the cover detects that the ice has fallen, it will automatically reset and start a new ice production cycle.

5. Turning off the device

-

Step 1: Briefly press the ON/OFF button to stop ice production and enter standby mode.

-

Step 2: Disconnect the power supply to turn off the ice maker.

6. Automatic self-cleaning program

a. Default cleaning time: 30 minutes.

b. How to start self-cleaning

-

Insert the water drain plug into the ice maker.

-

Fill the tank with drinking water, not exceeding the MAX line.

-

Press the ON/OFF button for 3 seconds.

-

The ADD WATER and ICE FULL lights will blink alternately.

c. How to cancel self-cleaning

-

The program will automatically end after the cleaning is complete.

-

Press the ON/OFF button during the cleaning procedure to cancel it manually.

d. How to clean the top cover

-

After the cleaning procedure is complete, open the top cover and remove the ice basket. Rinse the main tank and the additional water tank.

e. How to drain dirty water

-

Slide the ice maker to the edge of the countertop or table. Ensure that the device is stable.

-

Make sure there is a container for water (e.g., a sink) under the device.

-

Remove the drain plug from the bottom. Allow the dirty water to flow into the water container. Then reinsert the drain plug.

Note: Hygiene precautions

-

To ensure proper hygiene, change the water in the tank every 24 hours.

-

+ If the ice maker will not be used for at least one day, drain all the water and dry the tank.

PREPARING THE ICE MAKER FOR LONG-TERM STORAGE OR TRANSPORT

If the ice maker will not be used for an extended period or needs to be moved to another place, it must be properly operated and maintained. Familiarize yourself with the following tips.

1. Daily usage tips

Fill the device only with drinking water. Use only drinking water. The ice maker is intended for indoor use only. Place the ice maker on a level, flat surface, away from direct sunlight and heat sources (e.g., stove, oven, radiator). Ensure at least 15 cm of clearance between the sides of the device and the wall.

2. Regularly drain water

To maintain optimal sanitary conditions, we recommend changing the water in the tank every 24 hours. To prevent potential issues such as mold or fungus growth, if the device will not be used for more than 24 hours, it is recommended to thoroughly empty the tank.

3. Cleaning and disinfection

Clean the ice maker at least once a week, and perform a thorough cleaning once a month. Disconnect the power before cleaning: Always disconnect the ice maker from the power supply before cleaning.

Avoid using strong chemicals: For best results, use a special ice maker cleaning solution. Avoid using strong chemicals, including alcohol, vinegar, or other acids, as they may damage the evaporator and shorten the lifespan of the device.

Thorough cleaning before use: If the ice maker has not been used for an extended period, it should be thoroughly cleaned before reuse.

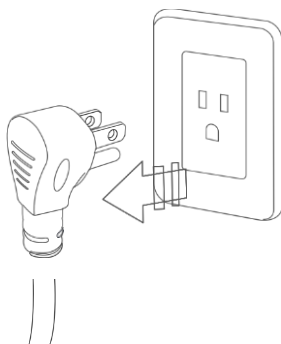

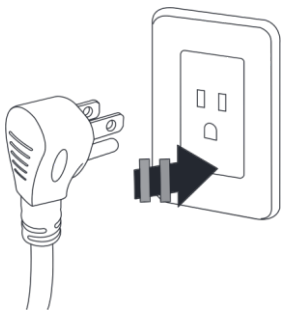

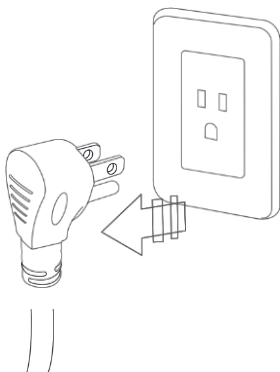

Step 6: Once finished, fill the device with drinking water. You can press the

ON/OFF button to restart the production of clean ice.

2. MONTHLY CLEANING

Step 1: Disconnect the ice making device from the power supply.



Step 2: Empty the ice cubes, remove the lower drain plug, and drain the water into

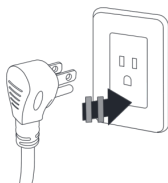
the sink, disconnecting the drain plug from the front at the bottom.

Step 3: Reinsert the drain plug. Rinse the interior and internal parts with clean water, then drain the water.



Step 4: Pour the cleaning solution into the tank up to the MAX level.

Step 5: Plug the ice maker back in. Press and hold the ON/OFF button for 5 seconds to activate the self-cleaning function.



Step 7: Unscrew the drain plug and drain the water into the sink.
Step 8: Reinsert the drain plug at the bottom.
Step 9: If necessary, run the cleaning function for additional cycles.
Step 10: After completion, fill the device with fresh water. You can press the ON/OFF button to restart the production of clean ice.

Note:

1. Avoid strong chemicals: Do not use strong chemicals or abrasive cleaners directly on any part of the ice maker. They can damage the surface and affect the taste of the ice.
2. Regular cleaning: To ensure optimal performance, the ice maker should be cleaned regularly.
3. Although the self-cleaning mode is helpful, it does not replace manual cleaning. The ice maker still requires manual cleaning. Use a mild cleaning agent approved for food contact (e.g., vinegar solution or descaling agent approved by the manufacturer) and a soft brush to scrub all internal surfaces, including hidden corners and crevices.
4. Since the ice maker is constantly in contact with water, any moisture, if not properly removed, can lead to mold growth over time. After use, the device should be dried. Always drain any remaining water and wipe the interior after cleaning to prevent moisture buildup and mold growth.
5. By following these simple tips, you can keep the ice maker clean and hygienic, ensuring a constant supply of fresh and clean ice.

PROPER DISPOSAL OF THIS PRODUCT



When the device is taken out of service, its disposal and handling of materials must comply with national regulations.

FAQ

1. How often should the ice maker be cleaned?

To ensure optimal performance, the ice maker should be cleaned at least once a week, depending on usage intensity. Regular cleaning prevents the buildup of scale, which can block the pump over time and cause device failure.

2. How to clean the ice maker?

It is recommended to clean it daily once or twice a week and perform a monthly cleaning once a month. Immediately after cleaning, the device should be emptied and then rinsed with clean water.

To maintain optimal performance and ice quality, it is recommended to empty the water tank at least once every three days. This routine maintenance helps minimize water hardness, eliminate contaminants, and prevent scale buildup in the tank.

3. Why are the ice cubes cloudy?

Cloudy ice cubes often result from using water that is not suitable for ice production. To achieve clearer ice, use drinking or distilled water. If water quality remains low, consider installing a water filter kit.

4. Can I pour milk or juice into the tank?

No, we strongly advise against this. High concentrations of milk or juice can clog the pump and shorten its lifespan. Additionally, milk proteins can calcify and react with the internal PU water tube of the device, potentially causing damage.

5. Why do my ice cubes melt quickly?

The ice making device does not have a freezing function that would allow for ice storage. High ambient temperatures, especially in summer, can accelerate melting. To slow down melting, follow these tips:

- Close the top cover (lid) to maintain internal temperature.
- Place a fan near the device to disperse heat.
- For long-term storage, transfer ice cubes to the freezer.

6. Why do our ice cubes stick together?

- Too long of an ice making cycle: stop the ice making device and restart it after the ice blocks have melted.
- Low water temperature in the tank: Fill the tank with water at a temperature between 40°F and 90°F.

7. Why do the ice cubes I made smell like plastic or dirty water?

Ice cubes from this device should be tasteless and odorless. If you detect a plastic smell, try performing the following thorough cleaning steps:

- Disconnect the device from the power supply for 2 hours to allow the ice cubes in the ice maker to melt;
- Empty the device of water;
- Add about 600 ml/200 oz (approximately 2 and 1/2 cups or 0.6 liters) of the ice maker cleaning solution to the water tank.
- Run the cleaning function and wait for the cleaning to complete;
- Then wait 4 hours and empty the ice maker of the cleaning solution;
- Add clean drinking water to the tank and run the cleaning function again.

8. Why does my device make sounds during operation?

- During operation, the device may make a gentle sound. Closing the top cover (lid) may help minimize noise levels.
- If you notice excessive noise coming from the device, it is recommended to perform a thorough cleaning (see instructions in FAQ section 7). This may alleviate the noise issue.

9. Why is water leaking from my machine?

- Leaks may occur if the internal water tube inside the ice maker becomes disconnected during transport. If you are familiar with basic appliance repairs, remove the back cover and reconnect the tube. If you are unsure or do not want to open the machine, contact Euhomy customer support for detailed instructions.

10. Why does water flow but no ice is produced?

- Ensure that the ice maker operates at room temperatures between 50°F and 105°F. For

the ice maker to function, use water temperatures between 40°F and 90°F. To assist you further, please send us a video or photo showing the problem.

- For self-adhesive products, ensure that spare parts are stored in their original packaging to maintain their adhesive properties.

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
